- This is a plan adopted by our district to help improve our students' social, emotional, and academic success by establishing positive strategies for defining, teaching, and supporting appropriate student behaviors to create a positive school environment.

• Be Safe. Be Respectful. Be Responsible. Be Caring.

• Purpose of PBIS Lesson Plan

- To have a template for teachers to use to remind our students of the expectations for our district/school.
- To support the implementation of our campus plans to teach/model our core expectations for behavior.
- To show how to accomplish our goals for the different areas of the school setting, and how that should look. We have displayed posters in our cafeteria, hallways, bathrooms, and bus area as reminders for our students.
- The lesson plans given to our teachers include copies of our posters and information to share with our students the importance of our rules and expectations.
- Showcase for students the incentives being utilized, and how being noticed for positive behavior comes with good rewards and praise. It is our duty to be examples and model how to gain positive attention vs negative attention.
