Mount Pleasant Independent School District is an award-winning, fully accredited K-12 school district located in Titus County in Northeast Texas serving 5,300 students on eight campuses. Mount Pleasant's population is a little over 16,000 people with a median income of \$38,903. MPISD offers Early Head Start, Head Start and Pre-K programs. The district also serves students at 4 elementary schools, 1 middle school, 1 junior high school and 1 high school utilizing a K-4, 5-6, 7-8, 9-12 configuration.

Our School

Mt Pleasant High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling approximately 1,500 students in grades 9–12. MPHS is accredited by the Texas Education Agency. While students are encouraged to volunteer in the community, community service hours are not required for graduation.

Standardized Test Results

- 35.1% of the Class of 2019 took the SAT or ACT
- State SAT average: 1027
- MPHS SAT Average: 1026
- State ACT Average Composite: 20.6
- MPHS ACT Average Composite: 19.6

GRADE POINTS

A weighted Grade Point Average (GPA) is used to determine class ranking and honor graduates. Grade points are earned for a particular grade in each semester of a course successfully completed and are only awarded at the end of each semester.
