SCHOOL READINESS DOMAINS

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL-

Social development refers to a child's ability to create and sustain meaningful relationships with adults and other children.

APPROACHES TO LEARNING-

The Approaches to Learning domain incorporates emotional, behavioral, and cognitive self-regulation under a single umbrella to guide teaching practices that support the development of these skills.

LANGUAGE & LITERACY-

Language development refers to emerging abilities in listening and understanding (receptive language) and in using language (expressive language).

COGNITION- Children play an active role in their own cognitive development by exploring and testing the world around them, but they also need support from parents, teachers, and other adults.

PERCEPTUAL, MOTOR, & PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT-

Perception refers to children's use of their senses to gather and understand information and respond to the world around them. Gross motor skills refer to moving the whole body and using larger muscles of the body, such as those in the arms and legs. Fine motor skills refer to using the small muscles found in individual body parts, especially those in the hands and feet.

DOMINIOS DE PREPARACIÓN ESCOLAR

SOCIAL EMOCIONAL

El desarrollo social se refiere a la capacidad del niño para crear y mantener relaciones significativas con adultos y otros niños.

ENFOQUES DE APRENDIZAJE

El dominio de enfoques para el aprendizaje incluye la autorregulación emocional, conductual y cognitiva bajo un solo paraguas para guiar las prácticas de enseñanza que apoyan el desarrollo de estas habilidades.

LENGUAJE Y ALFABETIZACIÓN


El desarrollo del lenguaje se refiere a las habilidades emergentes en escuchar y la comprensión (lenguaje receptivo) y en el uso del lenguaje (lenguaje expresivo).

COGNICIÓN- Los niños juegan un papel activo en su propio desarrollo cognitivo explorando y probando el mundo que los rodea, pero también necesitan el apoyo de padres, maestros y otros adultos.

DESARROLLO PERCEPTUAL, MOTOR Y FÍSICO

La percepción se refiere al uso que hacen los niños de sus sentidos para reunir y comprender información y responder al mundo que los rodea. Las habilidades de motoras gruesas se refieren al uso de los músculos de todo el cuerpo y usar los músculos gruesos como los de los brazos y piernas. Motoras finas se refiere a los músculos pequeños que se encuentran en partes individuales del cuerpo, especialmente en las manos y los pies.

Together-Time Activities



In a Kitchen

In the kitchen, you and your children can do many things together: put away groceries, prepare meals and snacks, set the table. Every family member can have a job to do! Your children will feel good about their successes as they use their large and small muscles and look for shapes and colors. Be sure the kitchen is a safe place. Keep sharp objects out of reach. Remind your children about family rules in the kitchen.

Help your children become aware of differences in foods.

- Talk with your children about the size, taste texture, and color of foods. Help them to recognize the differences between rough and smooth surfaces, salty or sweet tastes, and the odors of certain foods.
- Ask them to talk about changes in foods as you cook them ("How did it look when it was raw?... when we started to cook it?... how does it look now?"). Help your children to compare the before and after.
- Talk with your children about any foods that have special meaning to your family.

Look for shapes or colors around the kitchen in and on the cabinets, refrigerator and stove.

- Ask your children to find circles, triangles, or squares.

Play the game, "*I see something you don't see and the color (or the shape) IS...*" Your children can name the items or foods that are in the kitchen and that fit the description until they get to the item you have in mind. Set the table with your children.

- Ask your children to make sure there is one plate, one glass, and so on, for each person.
- Talk about how to handle the dishes and silverware, so they stay clean and unbroken.

Involve your children in meal preparation.

- All family members preparing food need to wash their hands before handling food.
- Measure with cups, tablespoons, and teaspoons. Ask your children to guess how many tablespoons make a cup of water. Then, help them check it out!
- Let your children pour water with spoons, cups, and pitchers.
- Involve your children in making part of a meal or a snack.
- Talk about opposites big and small, hard and soft.

Sort and name foods after a trip to the grocery store.



- Let your children name each food, or ask them to tell you something about each food, as you take it out of the bag.


- As you sort the groceries, ask your children to put together all the foods that are the same: fresh vegetables in one place, boxes in another place.
 - Talk with your children about the sizes of cans as you put them away—tall and short, wide and narrow.
- Name kitchen appliances and their uses.

- Ask your children what the toaster is for, what the oven does. Give safety tips for the use of each appliance, and talk about who can turn them on and off.
- Ask about other ways to toast bread, heat the leftovers. The answers might be very creative!

Let your children help clean up the kitchen.

- Ask them to sort eating and cooking utensils by type or use.
- Let them wipe the table after meals. Encourage them to wipe the table from left to right and collect all the crumbs in one corner.

Actividades para realizar juntos



En la cocina

En la cocina, usted y sus hijos pueden hacer muchas cosas juntos: guardar los alimentos, preparar comidas y meriendas y poner la mesa. ¡Cada miembro de la familia puede tener un trabajo! Sus hijos se sentirán bien con sus éxitos mientras usan sus músculos grandes y pequeños y buscan formas y colores. Asegúrese de que la cocina sea un lugar seguro. Mantenga los objetos punzantes fuera del alcance de sus hijos. Recuerde a sus hijos sobre las reglas familiares en la cocina.

Ayude a sus hijos a darse cuenta de las diferencias en los alimentos.

- Hable con sus hijos sobre el tamaño, el sabor, la textura y el color de los alimentos. Ayúdelos a reconocer las diferencias entre las superficies rugosas y lisas, los sabores salados o dulces y los olores de ciertos alimentos.
- Pídale que hablan de los cambios en los alimentos mientras se cocinan ("¿Qué aspecto tenía cuando estaba crudo?... cuando empezamos a cocinarlo?... ¿Qué aspecto tiene ahora?"). Ayude a sus hijos a comparar el antes y después.
- Hable con sus hijos sobre cualquier alimento que tenga un significado especial para su familia. Busque formas o colores alrededor de la cocina, en los gabinetes, el refrigerador y la estufa.
- Pídale a sus hijos que encuentren círculos, triángulos o cuadrados.

Juegue al juego, "Veo algo que tú no ves y su color (o su forma) es..." Sus niños pueden nombrar los artículos o alimentos que están en la cocina y que encajan con la descripción hasta que llegan al artículo que usted tiene en mente. Ponga la mesa con sus hijos.

- Pídale a sus hijos que se aseguren de que haya un plato, un vaso, y así sucesivamente, para cada persona.
- Hable sobre cómo manejar los platos y los cubiertos, para que permanezcan limpios y no se rompan. Involucre a sus hijos en la preparación de comidas.
- Todos los miembros de la familia que preparan alimentos deben lavarse las manos antes de tocar los alimentos.
- Midan con tazas, cucharas y cucharitas. Pídale a sus hijos que adivinen cuántas cucharadas de agua hay en una taza. ¡Entonces, ayúdelos a comprobarlo!
- Deje que sus hijos viertan agua con cucharas, tazas y jarras.
- Involucre a sus hijos al preparar parte de una comida o merienda.
- Hable de los opuestos: grande y pequeño; duro y blando.



Clasifique y nombre los alimentos después de una salida a la tienda de comestibles.

- Permita que sus hijos nombren cada alimento o pídale que le digan algo sobre cada alimento, mientras usted lo saca de la bolsa.
- Al ordenar los comestibles, pídale a sus hijos que junten todos los alimentos que son iguales: verduras frescas en un lugar, cajas en otro lugar.
- Hable con sus hijos sobre los tamaños de las latas, mientras los guardan: alto y corto, ancho y estrecho. Nombre los electrodomésticos y sus usos.
- Pregunte a sus hijos para qué es la tostadora y lo que hace el horno. Dé consejos de seguridad para el uso de cada aparato y hable de quién puede encenderlos y apagarlos.
- Pregunte sobre otras maneras de tostar pan o calentar los restos de comida. ¡Las respuestas pueden ser muy creativas!

Deje que sus hijos ayuden a limpiar la cocina.


Theme Job


Calm ing Strategy





Story Hand: Soothe Children's Stress About COVID-19

Use this Story Hand ritual to comfort and connect with a child who is feeling scared or anxious about COVID-19.


A Story Hand is an I Love You Ritual by Dr. Becky Bailey. It offers children soothing comfort and connection during difficult times. The adult massages each finger from base to top, starting with the pinkie. As you massage each finger, state one positive thing that's happened recently.

When you get to the thumb, verbalize a concern the child feels scared or anxious about. Then fold the thumb into the center of the palm, wrap the fingers over it and offer calm reassurance. This Story Hand shows sample words you might use for a child concerned by COVID-19.

Slow down, connect, be present and enjoy this profoundly helpful activity with a child who is having a tough time.




Investigating Books

3. It's okay if you don't read every word. While you read ask: What's happening in this picture/this book? What do you think the words say about the picture? What is your favorite part?


